

THE VENUE

The Rashid Karami International Exhibition Center



It is of major economic significance both locally and nationally. The site is located 15km from the central business district of Tripoli and 600m from the seashore. The total area of the Fair site is approximately 100 ha, used for the exhibition buildings and display areas. An area of 36 ha is used for landscaping and gardens and provides parking spaces for 3000 cars.

The venue comprises 20,000 m2 of indoor halls and 40,000 m2 of outdoor exhibition areas. The conference hall includes 16,000 seats.










NUMBER OF INDUSTRIAL FIRMS PER DISTRICT IN NORTH LEBANON 2017-2018

A STRATEGIC LAUNCHPAD FOR SYRIA'S RECONSTRUCTION

Tripoli is expected to become a launchpad for Syria's post-crisis reconstruction. The city's location and proximity to the Syrian borders make it a practical link between Syria and the global community. Tripoli could become one of the key supply routes to Syria's reconstruction investments, due to its strategic location between the Mediterranean Sea and some of Syria's most devastated provinces including Homs and Damascus.

CHINA RECENTLY MADE MAJOR ANNOUNCEMENTS TO POSITION ITSELF AS A KEY PLAYER NOT JUST IN SYRIA'S RECONSTRUCTION, BUT IN THE REGION. TO FACILITATE SUCH RECONSTRUCTION, IT NEEDS ACCESS TO A PORT ON THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN. SINCE TRIPOLI HAS A LARGE DEEP-WATER PORT, AND THE PROSPECT OF A RAILWAY TO TRANSPORT FREIGHT TO SYRIA, THE CHINESE GOVERNMENT HAS SHOWN PROFOUND INTEREST IN TRIPOLI'S DEVELOPMENT.

- * Tripoli's investment pipeline already exceeds \$220 million and is expected to reach \$400 million
- * The construction of a 35-km railroad will connect the PoT to the Syrian border
- **x** The first tranche for the railroad, valued at \$60 million, was jointly secured by the World Bank and the Islamic Development Bank
- **x** A Chinese construction company will soon submit a proposal to finance the reconstruction of the railway from Tripoli to the Lebanese-Syrian border

TRIPOLI SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONE (TSEZ)

It is the first project of its kind in Lebanon to develop a multi-use economic zone complete with all required infrastructure and utilities. The 55-hectare site is adjacent to the Port of Tripoli and offers many logistical advantages. TSEZ is expected to be a catalyst for the sustainable economic growth of Tripoli and the north of Lebanon.

PORT OF TRIPOLI

The giant Russian oil company Rosneft will soon start storing oil reserves in a specially built storage facility at the Port of Tripoli. The takeover will include a rehabilitation project that will create 450,000 metric tons of storage facilities in its first phase, and is likely to be expanded to 2 million in the future. The project is part of Lebanon's broader vision for the oil sector.



- * The redevelopment of the Port of Tripoli (PoT) for \$58 million will add a new container to Lebanon's second largest port and bring its processing capacity to 800,000 per year.
- × PoT has become the transshipment hub for East Asia as CMA CGM has launched a direct route between China and Southeast Asia to North Europe passing through PoT
- x 28% of Lebanese fruits and vegetables are exported from North Lebanon
