The event was also part of the Republic Day Celebrations. The Seminar was focused on the States of Goa and Kerala, the two most favored destinations for the Lebanese tourists in India.

The speakers included, Mr. Nikhil Desai, MD, Goa Tourism Development Corporation, Mr. Ahmad El Wazzan, Head of Public Relations Abroad Department, Lebanese Ministry of Tourism, Mr. Jean Abboud, President, Association of Travel & Tourism Agents in Lebanon (ATTAL) and Mr. Aouni Abdel Rahim, Members of Association for Development of Lebanese-Indian Relations (ADLIR). Members of ATTAL, ADLIR and other travel and tour operators attended the event. Promotional videos from Kerala and Goa were screened.

Ambassador Dr. Suhel Ajaz Khan gave an overview of demography of India, top touristic destinations and talked about tourism industry of India. Ambassador also spoke about the impact of Covid-19 pandemic on the tourism sector all over the world but highlighted that Indian tourism is able to make fast recovery from the Covid-19 related slump. Despite the pandemic, India is able to host the international guests following the Covid-19 protocols. Ambassador also spoke on the Free Tourist Visa Scheme of Government of India to first 5 lakh travellers to visit India and said that since the inception of this Scheme, the Embassy has many free tourist visa to Lebanese travellers.

Other speakers talked about the impact of Covid-19 on tourism industry and the challenges being faced by tourists. All the attendees shown great interest in taking more tour groups to India and to explore new touristic locations. Mr. Aouni Abdel Rahim spoke fondly about his visit to Kumbh Mela in India few years back and his regular visits to India for the past 37 years. A short film made by him on the Kumbh Mela, with a positive message of “live and let live”, was also screened.

Seminar “India Global Connect”

Embassy of India, Beirut organised a Seminar “India Global Connect” in association with Gems and Jewellery Export Promotion Council of India on February 4, 2022, to enhance trade in Gems and Jewellery sector with the focus on the Indian exports to Lebanon in this sector. The event was organized in hybrid mode.

The meeting was attended by Mr. Danny Gedaoun, Director General, Ministry of Industry, Dr. Mohammad Abou Haidar, Director General, Ministry of Economy and Trade, Mr. Boghus Kurdian, President of Syndicate of Jewelry, Mr. Mohammad Saleh, President of Chamber of Commerce Industry and Agriculture of Saida and South Lebanon, Dr. Linda Sultan, director at the Chamber of Commerce in Tripoli and North Lebanon. Top businessmen of gems and jewellery sector and other business representatives also attended the Seminar. From the Indian side the event was attended by Mr. R Aulanandan, Director, Department of Commerce, senior officials from Gems and Jewellery Export Promotion Council and a number of Indian exporters. Mr. Sabysachi Ray, ED from the GJEPC moderated the session.

In his remarks, Ambassador gave an overview of the gems and jewellery sector in India and spoke about complementarities between India and Lebanon in this sector. He also spoke about India’s strength in this sector and the benefit which Lebanon may avail from India by connecting directly with the India exporters. He encouraged all the participants to interact more with the GJEPC and participate in exhibitions organised by them.

He also utilized the opportunity to highlight the growth story of India, especially the fact that Indian economy is expected to grow by 9.2% in the current fiscal and by 8-8.5% in the next fiscal. He also mentioned about the recently announced Budget by Hon’ble Finance Minister of India. He specifically mentioned about PM Gatishakti National Master Plan – a seven-engine programme to develop roads, railways, airports, ports, mass transport, waterways and logistics infrastructure, PLI scheme, Startup ecosystem and how the Govt

is encouraging it with various budgetary measures, digitalization of the Indian economy etc. Many other programmes offered support to boost the economy were also touched upon.

He also informed all the participants that India is going to launch a digital money in the next financial year as announced in the recent budget. He also informed them about the ambitious target of India of USD 400 billion of export for this fiscal, out of which almost 80% has already been achieved. He also shared with them current celebrations of India@75 and Hon'ble Prime Minister's vision of India@100.

On the bilateral trade, Ambassador mentioned that even though the trade was impacted by the Lebanese economic crisis, there are good signs of recovery and the Indian exports to Lebanon have already touched 222 million USD by December 2021 in the current FY as against an overall export of 190 million USD in FY 20-21. He also mentioned that even though Indian exports of gems and jewellery to Lebanon is way below our target of USD 20 million in current FY, there also there is a growth as the exports in current FY of USD 6.4 million (up to December 2021) have surpassed the overall exports of 4.6 million USD in FY 2020-21.

Dr. Mohammad Abou Haider, Director General at the Ministry of Economy and Trade and Mr Danny Gedaoun, Director General at Ministry of Industry welcomed the Seminar and expressed hope that bilateral trade and economic cooperation between India and Lebanon could grow. The expressed full willingness of their respective ministries to support any initiative to enhance trade and economic cooperation between India and Lebanon.

Mr. Boghos Khurdian, President of Syndicate of Gems and Jewellery expressed readiness of the industry to explore trade opportunities with India, specially importing diamonds and other precious and semi-precious stones from India which can benefit local industry as it is also one of the export-oriented industries in Lebanon. He encouraged the participants to participate in various exhibitions in India and trade directly with the exporters in India. A number of other ideas and initiatives were discussed.

A presentation on India's strength in the gems and jewellery sector was made by GJEPC. There was an extensive question-and-answer session which was quite interactive. A number of exporters from India also made their interventions and expressed readiness to work with their Lebanese counterparts. Overall, it was a healthy and frank discussion. The Seminar was followed by a business luncheon hosted by Ambassador for the Lebanese participants.

In this bouquet, we Indians have an unwavering trust on democracy; this bouquet has the technology that will empower the 21st century; and it also has temperament and the talent of us Indians. The Multi-Lingual, Multi-Cultural environment in which we Indians live is a great power not only of India but of the whole world. This strength teaches not only to think for oneself in times of crisis, but also to work for the humanity. During the Corona time, we have seen how India, following the vision of 'One Earth, One Health', is saving crores of lives by providing necessary medicines and vaccines to many countries. Today India is the world's third largest pharma producer; it's a pharmacy to the world. Today, India is among those countries of the world whose health professionals and doctors are winning everyone's trust through their sensitivity and expertise.

Sensitivity is tested in times of crisis, but India's strength is an example for the whole world at the moment. During this crisis, India's IT sector has saved all the countries of the world by working round the clock. Today India is sending record software engineers to the world. More than 50 lakh software developers are working in India. Today India has the third largest number of Unicorns in the world. More than 10 thousand start-ups have been registered in the last 6 months. Today India has a huge, secure and successful digital payments platform. Last month alone, 4.4 billion transactions have been done through Unified Payments Interface in India.

Friends,

The digital infrastructure that India has developed and adopted over the years has become a huge strength of India today. Technological solutions like Arogya-Setu App for tracking Corona Infections and CoWin Portal for Vaccination are a matter of pride for India. The online facilities offered by India's CoWin portal - from slot booking to certificate generation, has caught the attention of people from bigger countries as well.

Friends,

There was a time when India was identified with the license raj and majority of the things were controlled by the government. I understand the challenges that have been there for doing business in India in those days.

We are constantly trying to overcome all the challenges. Today India is promoting Ease of Doing Business, minimizing government interference. India has made its corporate tax the most competitive in the world by simplifying and reducing it. Last year alone, we have eliminated more than 25 thousand compliances. India has regained the confidence of the business community by reforming measures like retrospective taxes. India has also deregulated many sectors like Drones, Space, Geo-spatial mapping. India has made major reforms in the outdated telecom regulations related to IT sector and BPO.

Friends,

India is committed to becoming a trusted partner in the world in global supply-chains. We are making way for free-trade agreement with many countries. The ability of Indians to adopt Innovation, new technology; the spirit of entrepreneurship of Indians; can give new energy to every global partner of ours. So this is the best time to invest in India. Entrepreneurship among Indian youth is at a new height today. In 2014 where there were few hundred registered startups in India, their numbers have crossed 60 thousand today. It also has more than 80 unicorns, of which more than 40 formed in 2021 itself. Just as expat Indians are showing their skills on the global stage, in the same way Indian youth are fully ready, geared up to give new heights to the all your businesses in India.

Friends,

India's commitment to deep economic reforms is another major reason that is making India the most attractive destination for investment today. During the Corona period, when the world was focusing on interventions like Quantitative Easing Program, India paved the way for reforms. The biggest projects to modernize digital and physical infrastructure got unprecedented momentum in the Corona times itself. More than 6 lakh villages in the country are being connected with optical fibre. An investment of \$1.3 trillion is being made, especially on connectivity infrastructure. Through Innovative financing tools like Asset monetization a target to generate \$80 billion has been set. India has also launched the Gati Shakti National Master Plan to bring every stakeholder on the same platform for promoting development. Under this National Master Plan, work will be done on infrastructure planning, development and implementation in an integrated manner. This will give a new impetus to seamless connectivity and movement of Goods, People and Services.

Friends,

While following the path of self-reliance, India's focus is not only on easing the processes, but also on incentivizing investment and production. With this approach, today, Production Linked Incentive schemes worth \$26 billion have been implemented in 14 sectors. The \$10 billion incentive plan to roll out the fab, chip and display industry is a testament to our commitment to making the global supply chain smooth. We are moving ahead with the spirit of Make in India, Make for the world. Along with telecom, insurance, defence, aerospace, now there are limitless possibilities offered by India in the field of semiconductors as well.

Friends,

Today India is drafting policies, taking decisions with regard to the present as well as the goals of the next 25 years. For this period, India has set the targets of high growth and saturation of welfare and wellness.

This period of growth will also be green, it will also be clean, it will also be sustainable, it will also be reliable. Continuing the tradition of making big commitments and living up to them for the global good, we have also set a target of net zero by 2070. India, with 17 per cent of the world's population, may contribute 5 per cent, only 5 percent in Global Carbon Emission, but our commitment to tackle Climate Challenge is 100 percent. Initiatives like International Solar Alliance and Coalition for Disaster-Resilient Infrastructure for Climate Adaptation are proof of this. As a result of the efforts of the past years, today 40% of our Energy Mix is coming from non-fossil fuel sources. We have already achieved the commitments made by India in Paris, 9 years before their target.

In the midst of these efforts, we also have to recognize that our lifestyle is also a big challenge for the climate. 'Throw away' culture and consumerism have made the climate challenge more serious. It is very important to rapidly shift today's 'take-make-use-dispose', economy towards circular economy. The same spirit is at the core of the idea of Mission LIFE that I discussed at COP-26. LIFE - means Lifestyle for Environment, a vision of such a Resilient and Sustainable Lifestyle which will be useful in not only dealing with Climate Crisis but also with futuristic unpredictable challenges. Therefore, it is important to transform Mission LIFE into a global mass movement. A public participation campaign like LIFE can be made into a big base for, P-3 'Pro Planet People'.


Friends,

Statue of Equality

The 'Statue of Equality' honouring Saint-Philosopher Sri Ramanujacharya, has been inaugurated by Hon'ble Prime Minister on February 5, 2022 in Muchhinthal village, Telangana, Hyderabad.

Born in 1017 in Sriperumbudur in Tamil Nadu, Ramanujacharya is revered as a Vedic philosopher and social reformer. He travelled across India, advocating equality and social justice. Ramanuja revived the Bhakti movement, and his preachings inspired other Bhakti schools of thought. Ramanuja was an advocate of social equality among all sections of people centuries ago, and encouraged temples to open their doors to everyone irrespective of caste or position in society at a time when people of many castes were forbidden from entering them.



Vasant Panchami

Also known as Saraswati Puja, the festival marks the beginning of "Basant", i.e. the spring season, and is dedicated to Goddess Saraswati, the Goddess of wisdom. According to Hindu mythology, Goddess Saraswati was born on this day and is the deity for wisdom and knowledge. Students worship the goddess by putting their books and pens near the idol.
